CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in December 2012. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts increased by 10 percent compared to the number received in December 2011. December 2012 approvals increased by 23 percent, denials decreased by 19 percent, and pending increased by 22% compared to December 2011.
