CHART NAME: APPLICATIONS FOR IMMIGRATION BENEFITS


WHAT IT DISPLAYS: The below chart provides data on applications and petitions received by USCIS for immigration benefits in January 2013. This chart excludes all data associated with the citizenship related applications.

WHAT IT SHOWS: Immigration application receipts decreased by 19 percent compared to the number received in January 2012. January 2013 approvals increased by 7 percent, denials decreased by 8 percent, and pending increased by 16% compared to January 2012.

- Major volumes of pending applications at the end of January 2013 include: 727,725 I-130 immediate/all other petitions; 362,436 I-485 applications to adjust status; 171,292 I-765 employment authorizations; 157,084 I-90 green card renewals/replacements; 125,417 I-751 remove conditions spouse jointly/waive; 56,348 I-131 travel document/advance parole; 33,397 I-129 forms filed.
